


Notice earlier -> react while it's easy



Communicate thoughtfully, with nuance


Be authentic and clear about the root causes – teams and your leaders credit clear talk that matches reality.

Failures are never binary – find places where your project partially succeeded and celebrate + solidify those


Preserve technical value for the future
